
FREE O-BEAD NECKLACE PATTERN BY AKKE JONKHOF



You need:






5 grams O beads (B)




70/80 pinch beads (C)




70/80 round beads 4 mm (D)




Pick up 1 A, 1B, 1A, 1B and 1A and pass back through the second hole. Pick up 1C and pass back through the second hole of the A bead you started this step with.



- 2) Pass back through the first hole and pass also for a second time through the next B, A, B and A.
- 2A) Pick up 1B, 1A, 1B, 1 A and pass back through the second hole, Pick up 1 C and pass through the second hole of the A you started this step from
- 3) Repeat step 2 and 2A till you have the correct length for your necklace






4) Take a new thread. You need twice the length of your necklace. Pass through the first A bead top hole, Leave a tail that you can use to connect the clasp. Pass back through the second hole and pass through the first hole a second time. Pick up

1D and pass through the top hole of the next A. Add D beads between all A beads. If all D beads are strung between the A beads, you can use your thread to find the right tension for the D beads between the A beads.

5) Pick up 1D and the clasp and pass through the A of the previous row. Pass also through the next C and the A you started this step from. Pass back through



the first hole and repeat this thread path to make a firm connection between the necklace and the clasp

Add the other part of your clasp at the other end of the necklace

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
